WHO WE ARE, WHAT WE DO

THE CALIFORNIA COMMUNITY LAND TRUST NETWORK (CACLTN) is a membership organization representing the Community Land Trusts (CLTs) of California with 26 nonprofit members across the state from Humboldt County to the Mexican border. The Network maintains a program of peer-to-peer capacity building and technical assistance, public education, and policy advocacy aimed at expanding the impact of community controlled, permanently affordable housing for low-income people.

The Network's mission is to support existing and emerging Community Land Trusts in California in their efforts to develop and steward community-controlled housing and facilities that will remain affordable in perpetuity.



In 2021, with the COVID pandemic causing unprecedented strain on low-income communities, CACLTN made advocacy for permanently affordable, community controlled housing a top priority. We advocated for housing justice through:





THE FORECLOSURE INTERVENTION HOUSING PRESERVATION PROGRAM (FIHPP)


- **In 2021**, CACLTN advocated for a new state funding stream to catalyze the preservation of tenants at risk of displacement
- On July 19th, **2021** the Foreclosure Intervention Housing Preservation (FIHPP) program became law, promising **\$500 million** for the acquisition and rehab of buildings across the state






